

Sherrill Park Golf Course 1

Tips from the Pro's

Hole # 1: Favor right side of fairway. Reachable in two. Second shot favor center or left side of fairway.

Hole # 2: Position tee shot in the right center of fairway. Second shot must be accurate because of water in front of the green with a very shallow green.

Hole # 3: Hit enough club. Left side of green safer side.

Hole # 4: Position tee shot left of the fairway bunker. Green is very shallow. Must hit the second shot the proper distance. The green is guarded by a very deep bunker.

Hole # 5: Accurate tee shot a must. Can be reachable downwind. Lay-up should be center of fairway between the two fairway bunkers.

Hole # 6: Center of green should be your target. Favor the right side of green because of water on the left side of green.

Hole # 7: Play to center of fairway. Must carry second shot to the green because of the elevation of the green.

Hole # 8: Favor the left center of the fairway. Take enough club on your second shot because it plays a little up hill.

Hole # 9: Favor the left side of fairway because of fairway bunker on the right. Second shot must carry green because of elevation in front of the green.

Hole # 10: Water left and right off the tee. Hit a long iron from the tee. Favor the left side. From the fairway don't miss long or left.

Hole # 11: Reachable par five, with a perfect drive. Water all the way down the left side of the hole. If you can't get home in two, lay up with a mid iron. Deep bunker in front.

Hole # 12: Drive must be in fairway. Second shot is to a three quarter island green. Do not miss long or right.

Hole # 13: Biggest green on the course. This green is easy to three putt, if you're on the wrong side.

Hole # 14: Long par five, all up hill. OB left and trees right, the entire length of the hole. Hit enough club on your approach. The green has a false front.

Hole # 15: Par three a little uphill. The green is wide and narrow. Cannot see the putting surface from the tee.

Hole # 16: Slight dog leg left. Favor the left side of the fairway. The green is slightly downhill.

Hole # 17: Probably the hardest hole on the course. A long and accurate drive is a must to get around the corner. Water all the way down the right side. You cannot miss the green right.

Hole # 18: Three wood or long iron off the tee. A water hazard that you can not see from the tee runs across the fairway. A large bunker protects the right side of the green.

Tips from the Pro's

Hole # 1: Favor the right side of the fairway. This opens your angle into the green. The green is very long.

Hole # 2: Challenging tee shot with water on both sides of fairway. Your target off the tee will be the second fairway bunker. This angle will set you up with a nice approach into the green.

Hole # 3: Enjoy elevation of tee shot. Long hitters may take 3 wood downwind. Second shot favor the center of green.

Hole # 4: Opportunity to bounce the ball onto the green. Do not miss long.

Hole # 5: Favor the left side of fairway. Lay up will be short of the pond. Be aware of the creek across the fairway, about 100 yards from the green.

Hole # 6: Pick your line. Pick your club. Play to a position that will leave you a short shot into the green. Long hitters can challenge the green.

Hole # 7: Left center is your target. Play for position to open up your approach shot.

Hole # 8: Beware of the bowl on left side of green. Hit enough club.

Hole # 9: Fairway works left towards the bunker. Head over snack bar or bar depending on how you're playing.

Hole # 10: Maybe not driver off the tee. Play to right center of fairway for best approach into the green. Very long green.

Hole # 11: Favor right side of fairway. Second shot can play longer because of elevated green.

Hole # 12: Hit enough club. Right side of green is safer side.

Hole # 13: Position tee shot short of bunkers. This will open up your approach to a 2 level green.

Hole # 14: Much wider fairway. Pay attention to pin placement because it will dictate your tee shot location.

Hole # 15: Second shot should played between the lone tree and fairway bunker. This opens your approach shot into a blind green.

Hole # 16: Maybe the best par 3. Good luck. Choose your target line. The green slopes right to left.

Hole # 17: Short and sweet. Very long green. The closer you drive to the fairway bunker, the better your angle into the green.

Hole # 18: Use right bunker as your target line. The slope of the fairway will work your ball left into the middle.
