1. *Bass Performance Hall*; 525 Commerce Street, Fort Worth, 76102; Phone: 817.212.4380; www.basshall.com
 - ❖ The Bass Performance Hall is one of the Top 10 opera houses in the world. It houses the Fort Worth Opera, Fort Worth Symphony Orchestra, the Texas ballet theater and various touring Broadway shows and performers.

 - ❖ Home to the largest performing arts organization in Tarrant County, this venue presents the best of the musical theater and award-winning original plays. This "House of Tomorrow" stages a wide variety of shows, including Children's Playhouse.

 - ❖ Fort Worth Botanical Gardens is home to more than 2,500 species of plants in its 21 specialty gardens. Plan a visit to the world-renowned Japanese Gardens or exploring the winding paths of luxuriant tropical foliage in the 10,000 square foot conservatory.

 - ❖ The new facility opened in November 2009 and incorporates a major new center for the Cattle Raisers Museum. Exhibits also include DinoLab, the Noble Planetarium, the Fort Worth Children's Museum, Innovation Studios and the Omni Imax Theater.
5. *Fort Worth Stockyards National Historic District*, 121 East Exchange Avenue, Fort Worth, 76164; Phone: 817.624.4741; www.fortworthstockyards.org
 - ❖ The Stockyards was once the second largest cattle market in the world. The district brims with entertainment, including restaurants, shopping and Wild West performances. Daily cattle drives are held at 11:30 am and 4 pm.

6. *Fort Worth Water Gardens Park*; 1502 Commerce Street, Fort Worth, 76102; Phone: 817.871.5755
 - ❖ One of five separate water features, the breathtaking falls can be viewed from below and offer a fabulous view of gushing waters tumbling over the rocks above. The park also includes trees and naturalized plantings in its four acres and is a great place to have lunch outside. It's also ideal if you simply want to walk about and enjoy the tranquility.

 - ❖ The Fort Worth Zoo is home to more than 500 species of animals. Indoor and outdoor exhibits include World of Primates, Asian Falls, Raptor Canyon, Thundering Plains, Texas Wild!, The Great Barrier Reef and the Museum of Living Art (MOLA).

 - ❖ The Modern Maintains one of the foremost collections of postwar art in the central US, consisting of more than 3,000 significant works of modern and contemporary international art.

 - ❖ A 212-acre theme park features more than 100 awesome rides and great shows for the entire family. One of the park's attractions, the Titan roller coaster, towers over the Texas Giant, one of Six Flags' most popular rides and the top-rated wooden roller coaster in the world. Looney Tunes USA, a family-oriented section offers rides and attractions customized to the little ones.
