

Activities on Maui ~ Simple as ABC

- A - for Aquarium** Take a journey and visit the Maui Ocean Center, Maui's Hawaiian Aquarium. See spectacular live coral displays, sea turtles, sharks, rays and more. Enjoy self-paced, interactive exhibits with your entire family.
- B - for Buddha** See the largest Buddha outside of Japan at the Lahaina Jodo Mission. The Amida Buddha is cast of copper and bronze and stands twelve feet high and weighs approximately three and one-half tons. Located at 12 Ala Moana Street just off of Front Street.
- C - for Culture** The Bailey House Museum is located in the historic town of Wailuku and showcases Hawaiian culture, artifacts, paintings and furniture from nineteenth-century Maui. Open Monday-Saturday from 10am-4pm.
- D - for Discover** Discover a tropical paradise as you drive along the rugged Hana shoreline where picturesque views of spectacular waterfalls and some of the islands most beautiful beaches are located. For those who prefer to relax and let someone else do the driving, daily tours are available. Please contact the Island Activities desk for assistance.
- E - for Exploring** Explore the Makena coastline, just a short drive south of the resort. Here you will find pristine beaches, incredible sunsets and views of Molokini and Kahoolawe.
- F - for Floral Gardens** Stroll through acres of exotic plants and flowers when you visit Kula Botanical Gardens (Monday-Saturday) and Enchanting Floral Gardens of Maui (daily). Both are located in upcountry Kula, a perfect stop on the way to or from Haleakala Crater.
- G - for Golf** Maui has 16 golf courses for you to enjoy during your stay. The Wailea Golf Club, home of the Senior Skins Game offers three award winning courses. Heading west you will find Kaanapali's North and South Course and further west the Kapalua Bay, Village and Plantation Course where the Mercedes Golf Championship is held. For assistance with tee times please contact the Island Activities desk.
- H - for Ho'okipa Beach Park** Wind surfers from all over the world come to ride some of the biggest waves during the winter season. Ho'okipa is at the beginning of the road to Hana, just past Paia.
- I - for 'Iao Valley State Park** 'Iao Valley is a peaceful area with natural pools and lush green covered peaks that are many times covered by mist. The 'Iao Needle is a natural rock pinnacle standing 2250 feet high. A leisurely stroll through this tropical paradise is an excellent activity for the entire family.
- J - for Jog** Our ocean front path is perfect for an early morning jog or walk and also offers a scenic setting for a relaxing sunset stroll.
- K - for Kū'ula Stone** While walking south along the beach path, you will find a fishing shrine of Kū'ula Stone. Here the first catch was laid as an offering to ensure a bountiful sea.
- L - for Luau** Join us for Wailea's Finest Luau on our oceanfront Luau Lawn from 5:00 – 8:00pm you can experience our traditional luau buffet and authentic hula show which includes our three time world champion fire knife dancer. Please call 874-7831 for reservations.
- M - for Molokini** A crescent moon shaped island formed by a volcanic cinder cone, Molokini offers pristine waters with an abundance of sea life that makes it one of the top destinations for divers and snorkelers. There is a wide selection of catamarans, sailboats, power boats and zodiacs to choose from. Please contact the Island Services desk for reservations and additional information.
- N - for North Shore** Visit the historic town of Paia where you will find an array of interesting shops, arts and crafts and restaurants. This is the perfect place to stop on your way to Hana to relax with a cup of coffee before continuing on your way.

O - for Ocean

Maui has some of the most beautiful beaches in the world. Enjoy swimming, snorkeling, diving, kayaking or just sit back and watch the sunset! P - for Prison

Built in 1852 and also known as Hale Pa'ahao (the stuck in the irons house) the prison once housed prisoners for such offenses as deserting their ships and drunkenness. Today the prison is used for happier occasions such as town meetings and other functions. Open daily from 8:00am - 4:00pm.

Q - for Queen

Queen Ka'ahumanu Shopping Center...need souvenirs, a bathing suit or just something special? Stop by Queen Ka'ahumanu Shopping Center in Kahului where you will find a fine selection of shops, restaurants and movie theaters.

R - for Rejuvenate

Treat yourself to the ultimate spa experience at the Mandara Spa. Located at the resort the Mandara Spa offers an extensive menu of treatments such as the Tropical Delight, Pampered in Paradise, Pacific Retreat and more. Full salon services are available as well. S - for Sugar Cane Train

The Lahaina Ka'anapali & Pacific Railroad's train is an authentic reproduction of a sugar cane train that once traveled through the sugar cane fields of west Maui. Although sugar cane is no longer grown in west Maui, the train will take you on a six mile scenic ride where you will have incredible views of the west Maui mountains, neighboring islands and possibly a whale or two (December – May).

T - for Tennis

For tennis buffs, the Wailea Tennis Club is a match made in paradise offering eleven courts, three lit for night play. Sign up for a lesson with a certified teaching professional or for one of the clinics offered weekly. Ask about the club's round robin, it's a fun way to meet other tennis fans.

U - for 'Ulalena

'Ulalena is the story of the Hawaiian islands, as told through song, dance and music and features the talents of some of Hawaii's most distinguished musicians and performers. 'Ulalena is an exciting theatrical stage production that will entertain all ages.

V - for Volcano

Take a scenic drive to visit Haleakala Crater and National Park. Haleakala (house of the sun) summit reaches 10, 023 feet above sea level and offers one of the world's most spectacular views. W - for Winery

This is upcountry Maui at its best, 2000 feet above sea level with sweeping views of the central valley and the west Maui mountains. Taste award winning wine and take a free guided tour. Picnic tables are available if you care to bring lunch or a snack. Tasting room is open daily from 9:00 – 5:00 (except for major holidays).

X - for X-ercise

Get fit at the Wailea Marriott's fitness center! Open 24 hours every day to give you a healthy, happy body.

Y - for Yacht

Sailing is one of the great adventures on Maui. There is a fine selection of yachts to choose from offering morning sails, sunset sails and more. Z - for Zodiac

For a chance to see places not accessible by larger boats, try a rafting and snorkel trip. Explore sea caves and coastlines with incredible views and on many occasions see spinner dolphins, sea turtles and whales (seasonal).
