Top 10 Things to Do in Seattle

Featured Attraction



Pike Place Market

The public market overlooking the Elliott Bay is one of the oldest continually operated public farmers' markets in the United States. The major attraction is Pike Place Fish Market, where employees throw three-foot salmon and other fish to each other rather than passing it by hand. The first Starbucks Coffee store, founded in 1971, is located at Pike Place which is one block away from its original historic venue. The sounds of street performers and the scent of freshly garden cut flowers will surely be a memory you want to have.

Seattle Underground Tour

A humorous guided tour of underground passageways and buildings. Learn the stories of the cabinetmaker that accidentally burnt the city of Seattle to the ground and the infamous Skid Row.

Ride the Ducks

Tour Seattle by land and water on a WWII amphibious landing craft! Tour sights include the Sleepless in Seattle houseboat, historic Pioneer Square, and Safeco/Qwest Fields.

Washington State Ferry Terminal

It is the largest fleet of passenger and automobile ferries in the United States. Visit the Puget Sound Islands departing from Pier 52.

Space Needle

Built for the World's Fair in 1962, its completion stood as the tallest building west of the Mississippi River. Featuring an observation deck and rotating restaurant 500 feet above, it has been awarded the honor of being a historic Seattle landmark in 1999.

Seattle Waterfront

From local wines to alligator feet back scratchers; each shop is set to be its own adventure. A seafood appetite can certainly be captured from restaurants ranging from open air to sophistication.

Museum of Flight

The largest private air and space museum in the world hosts over 150 historic air, spacecraft, and related artifacts in unique and inspiring exhibits.

Seattle Aquarium

Stand within a circle of glowing jellyfish or run your fingers along a sea anemone's tentacles. Interact with staff members on exhibits and feedings.

Experience Music Project

Founded by Microsoft co-founder, Paul Allen, the museum holds displays rock memorabilia and science fiction movie props.

Seattle Art Museum

Commonly known as "SAM", the facility collection includes nearly 25,000 pieces. Among them is the popular *Hammering Man* located at the entrance of the building.
