Historic Old San Juan

This is a 465-year-old neighborhood originally conceived as a military stronghold. Its 7-square-block area has evolved into a charming residential and commercial district. The city includes more than 400 carefully restored 16th- and 17th-century Spanish colonial buildings among other sites such as The San Juan Cathedral, 3 Forts, abundant shopping and many open air cafes and restaurants featuring world class dining.

Bioluminescent Bay Fajardo High

Las Croabas Lagoon in Fajardo has 500,000 to 700,000 bioluminescent dinoflagellates (a kind of plankton) per gallon, so when you wave your hand through the water you trigger so many of them that your hand seems to light up with a thousand tiny stars. It is a rare, natural wonder that you can experience while visiting Puerto Rico

Arecibo Observatory

When it comes to telescopes, there are few as awe-inspiring as the one at Arecibo Observatory in Puerto Rico. Most, however, are more likely to recognize Arecibo from its roles in Hollywood movies, as the giant telescope featured prominently in the final scene of the James Bond film Goldeneye and was also the antenna used by Jody Foster in her search for alien signals in the movie adaptation of Contact.

Catamaran Snorkeling Culebra

Visit Flamenco Beach, which is considered the second most beautiful beach in the world by Discovery Channel and by far the most popular beach in Culebra. Follow up the snorkeling with, lunch, refreshments, pina colodas and rum drinks.

El Yunque Rain Forest

The El Yunque rainforest is a sub tropical mountainous forest located in the eastern part of Puerto Rico where the trade winds first meet the island. The Forest contains rare wildlife including the Puerto Rican Parrot, which is one of the ten most endangered species of birds in the world and is a must see for explorers and nature lovers.

Deep Sea Fishing

While fishing is good year round, the winter season from October to early March is among the best. Blue marlin can be caught all summer and into the fall, and renowned big game fish tournaments take place in August and September. Big game fish are found close to shore across Puerto Rico.

Surfing in Isla Verde

Pine Grove beach is a crescent, white-sand beach, whose tranquil, rich blue waters are protected by an offshore reef from the often rough Atlantic current. There's more of a surf to the east, which is a popular spot for surfing, boogie boarding, and body surfing as the waves are well formed but never too big, which makes it a perfect spot to learn to surf. Local surfers give lessons and rent boards from this beach as well.
