Washington Monument

The Washington Monument is the most prominent structure in Washington, D.C. and one of the city's early attractions. It was built in honor of George Washington, who led the country to independence and then became its first President.

Metro stop: Smithsonian on the Mall

Arlington National Cemetery

Interred are thousands of veterans and government personnel. Tomb of the Unknowns- and Unidentified soldier from the Korean War and each World War is buried here; the Vietnam War soldier's tomb has been empty since identification in 1998.

Metro stop: Arlington National Cemetery

World War II Memorial

Commemorates the sacrifice and celebrates the victory of "the greatest generation." Friedrich St. Florian's winning design balances classical and modernist styles of architecture, harmonizes with its Natural and cultural surroundings, and connects the legacy of the American Revolution and the American Civil War with a great crusade to rid the world of fascism.

US Capitol

The Capitol is home to the U.S. Congress and its two legislative bodies, the U.S. House of Representatives and the U.S. Senate. Through films, exhibits, and tours, you will learn about how Congress works, how this magnificent building was built, and how citizens can participate in this Extraordinary experiment called representative democracy.
