MIAMI BEACH

Miami Beach is known for sun-bathing, tanning and swimming; is also rich in history as an entertainment and cultural destination. From world-famous Art Deco architecture to renowned nightclubs and designer fashions, it's no wonder tourist venture here from all over the world to enjoy one of the world's premier beachfronts and the beautiful blue waters of the Atlantic Ocean.

LINCOLN ROAD MALL

ADRIENNE ARSHT CENTER

PÉREZ ART MUSEUM MIAMI

Perhaps the most important museum in Miami, PAMM opened its doors in December 2013 just in time for Art Basel. Dedicated to international art of the 20th and 21st centuries from the perspective of the Americas, the bayfront museum boasts an impressive permanent collection, as well as compelling exhibitions

AMERICAN AIRLINES ARENA

If you're looking for the biggest acts in music, look no further. The American Airlines Arena, home of the Miami Heat, hosts world tour stops for internationally renowned acts such as Beyonce, Madonna, Coldplay and many more.

MIAMI CITY BALLETT

The Miami City Ballet is among the largest ballet companies in the United States with a repertoire of 94 ballets including a number of world premieres. Enjoy the Company in regular series from October through March including the million-dollar holiday spectacular, George Balanchine's The Nutcracker™.

MIAMI BEACH BOTANICAL GARDEN

This 2.6-acre urban greenspace showcases Florida native plants and trees, with garden subsets including a Japanese garden, edible garden and water garden. Cascading oolite fountains frame the Great Lawn, perfect for a casual picnic. A free self-guided phone tour offers additional information on the history of the Garden and plantings.

JEWISH MUSEUM OF FLORIDA

This building was once Miami Beach's first synagogue. Now a museum, it commemorates the more than 200 years of Judaism in South Florida. Mosaic: Jewish Life in Florida is its permanent exhibit, with additional exhibits visiting throughout the year. The museum is also free on Saturdays.

MIAMI SEAQUARIUM[®]

Located on a 38-acre tropical paradise with spectacular skyline views is a place where dolphins walk on water and killer whales fly through the air. Enjoy 8 different marine animal shows and much more!

WYNWOOD WALLS

Open to the public, free of charge the Wynwood Walls was established in 2009 by the legendary placemaker and visionary Tony Goldman as an outdoor museum of international street art. Wynwood Walls has become a phenomenon, spurring the creation of murals throughout the Wynwood district. It is now one of the best venues in the world to see the work of leading street artists.
